Supplementary Regulations

[1] Announcement

TR Register will organise a Clubmans Production Car Autotest Taster Event on 29 June 2024 at The Three Counties Showground, Malvern

[2] Jurisdiction

This meeting will be held under the General Regulations of Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), and these Supplementary Regulations. Refer also to Motorsport UK Magazine

[3] Permits

Motorsport UK Permit No(s): This has been applied for.

Route Authorisation No: Not applicable

[4] Eligibility

The event is open to all members of the public with a valid driving licence. No need to belong to a car club

Entrants do not need to produce a club membership card but must hold a UK driving licence and an RS Clubman Licence: No car club membership card needed.

One nominated passenger may be carried on the timed tests to assist in giving directions to the driver. Passengers also need a RS Clubman Licence

The passenger, if carried, must occupy the seat adjacent to the driver, and wear a properly fastened and approved seatbelt at all times during the tests, unless the age of the car does not require or allow for seatbelts.

The passenger, if carried in a saloon car, or sports car with a hardtop fitted, must be aged at least 12 years or older and at least 135cm in height.

The passenger, if carried in a sports car or cabriolet, with a hood lowered or erect, must be aged at least 16 years or older.

Passengers must not use a hand-held camera inside the car

All cars must comply with Motorsport UK Technical Regulations, noting the requirements of Section M Para. 21-24 of the Motorsport UK Blue Book 2022 (Specific Regulations for Production Car Autotests).

All vehicles must have been driven to the event.

The scrutineer will carry out visual checks on general roadworthiness and shall pay particular attention to the following:

Visually check vehicle is of sound construction and mechanical condition

Visually check vehicle is well maintained

The driver must declare the car has been driven to the event and so be road legal

Competition cars may be driven only as demonstration drives. The driver must certify that the car has competed this year

Test seat security

Check seat belts, where fitted, are secure and functioning properly

Check steering play not excessive

Check brake pedal feel

Check throttle closing springs functioning

Check condition of tyres

Cars should be presented for scrutineering in a clean and tidy condition, and particularly free from "clutter".

The acceptance, or otherwise, of any car shall be at the sole discretion of the Scrutineer.

Scrutineering starts at 9.30 on 29 June 2024 at the Three Counties Showground.

[7] Event Start

The event will start at 10.00

Nature of Start: 3, 2, 1, GO

Handicapping Details: None

Any competitor not signed on by 1pm may be excluded.

[8] Description of Event

This is a Clubman Production Car Autotest (Taster Event) with a course layout designed for forward direction only, comprising a series of turns around numbered / lettered cones

Timing will be by mobile phones

Overall Course length: About 400 metres. The course is laid out across more than one individual area, each being no more than 200m by 200m.

All general regulations of the MSA apply as written except:

M11.3 Without exception a single car may be entered by no more than two drivers. M 6.6 Cones may be less than 1 metre high.

All vehicles must be taxed and insured for the public road. It will not be necessary to show paperwork but drivers must declare this to be true.

The course layout will be handed out during scrutineering

The following classes will apply: Fastest 4 or fewer cylinder car
Fastest 5 or 6 cylinder car
Fastest 7 or more cylinder car
Most entertaining drive

[9] Vehicles Starting Positions

Cars will start from behind the start line. The timing marshal may ask the drivers to adjust their car's position before starting.

[10] Practicing Requirements

Practicing will be permitted.

[11] Identification

Identification numbers will not be required by the organisers.

[12] Parc Ferme

The holding / service area and perimeter barriers will separate the public from the tests. limit of 5 MPH is imposed within the holding / service area. Extreme care must be taken when moving cars in this area.

[13] Judges of Fact

All Marshals are Judges of Fact and will be identified by wearing hi-viz clothing

[14] Television Coverage

Is not expected

[15] Awards

Awards will be presented as follows: -Fastest time of the day for each class Most entertaining drive

[16] Entries

The maximum entry for the meeting is 24 and the minimum is 6. Entries will close when 24 places have been booked

[17] Entry List

The entry list opens 20 March 2024 and closes finally on 29 June 2024 at 09:30.

Entries may be online or on the day payable to the TR Register

[18] Entry Fee/Refunds

The Entry Fee is £15. All entries must be made on the official form and be accompanied by the entry fee.
